- a. Christian response to future
 - b. Philp 1:18 Response "Christ is preached"
 - cannot predict future, but can decide who to trust, how to respond
 - c. Philp book of rejoicing in problems
 - Paul was in prison
 - Paul had contentment surrounded by people of discontentment
 - d. Three principles of contentment
2. Connected With God's People (vs. 10)
- a. Church at Philippi in Macedonia
 - very poor people - little money
 - yet sent gift to Paul's needs
 - b. Macedonian church sent their love
 - Paul rejoiced in their care
 - c. Gift produced joy & encouragement
 - sometimes they lacked care
 - package contents - no opportunity
 - this time they able to send gift
 - they sent gifts multiple times
 - d. Response to future - joy & contentment

- a. Church started by the river
 - b. Moved to Lydia's home
 - c. Acts 16:12-40 Paul & Silas at Philippi in Macedonia

- e. Paul learned contentment in whatever condition he lived
